We have now received the report from the quality of education review and here are just a few of the very positive comments from it:

At Down Ampney there is an impressive culture of reading that permeates the school. The culture of reading is a standout feature of the school. Reading for pleasure starts early at Down Ampney. Down Ampney Church of England Primary School places a strong emphasis on mathematics, fostering a positive and engaging environment for pupils to develop their mathematical concepts and skills. Pupils' behaviours for learning ensure a high level of engagement in maths. During the staff survey and staff interviews the following was quoted, *'Staff are empowered by the headteacher, and all feel valued. The school has made huge progress…and all staff have been made to feel integral in that progress.''Everyone is cared for, and decisions are always made based around the best interests of the children.' 'The headteacher is mindful of home life stresses of staff and does her best to help alleviate workload, when needed and this has contributed hugely to the wellbeing of the staff.' The school's mantra, 'small classes, big opportunities' is lived out by all. Consequently, in many aspects of its work, including personal development, the school punches well above its weight.*
