Writing

- ❖ Write familiar words & short phrases using a model or vocabulary list. EG: 'I play the piano'. 'I like apples'.
- ❖ Write some short phrases based on familiar topics and begin to use connectives/conjunctions and the negative form where appropriate. EG: My name, where I live and my age.

Grammar

Start to understand the concept of noun gender and the use of articles. Use the first person singular version of high frequency

Prior Learning

• The letter sounds (phonics & phonemes) from 'Phonics & Pronunciation' lesson 1. • Vocabulary from the 'I Am Learning French' unit. • What a noun and article/determiner is in English. • What a verb is in English.

Phonics covered in this unit

- The 'r' sound in French is guttural made from the back of the throat like in the words 'triangle', 'guitare and 'clarinette'.
- There are many last consonant silent letters in French. The final letter 's' is silent in the word 'les' and 'des'. pronounced almost like 'leh' and 'deh'.
- OU sound in joue ON sound in non & violon
- ❖ When the preposition de is followed by the definite article les it becomes des but the 's' in des is silent.
- Starting to explore the four French nasal sounds (on, un, in and an). Words like violon and instruments.

Cultural Capital

Children will learn about key figures from French history such as St Bernadette, William the Conqueror, Napoleon, Louis Pasteur, Gustave Eiffel, Coco Chanel and Claude Monet.

❖ Better understand the concept of gender and which articles to use for meaning (EG: 'the', 'a' or 'some'). Introduce simple adjectival agreement (EG: adjectival agreement when describing nationality), the negative form and possessive adjectives. EG: 'In my pencil case I have...' or 'In my pencil case I do not have...'

Unit Skills and outcomes

- * Recognise, recall and spell up to 10 instruments in French with the correct definite article/determiner.
- ❖ Understand articles/determiners better and that the definite article/determiner 'the' has a plural form in French.
- Learn to say and write 'I play an instrument' in French using the high frequency 1st person regular verb 'je joue' (I play) with up to 10 different instruments.
- Learning to recognise and learn cognates such as triangle, piano, clarinette first.
- Starting to build a short phrase in French using personal pronoun (je), conjugated verb 1st person verb (joue), and partitive article (du, de la or des).
- Choosing and ordering these words accurately.

They will also experience a range of the following during Key Stage 2:

- French publications (such as newspapers) and books
- Listening to French radio
- Listening to French music
- Watching French television programmes and/or films
- Eating French food
